

Housing in the Spotlight

Recent Housing Developments

Housing affordability in the Bow Valley has emerged as a prominent concern, affecting not only the lives of residents but also the region's businesses and workforce. The high cost of housing has led to a substantial churn in the workforce, making it increasingly challenging for local businesses to attract and retain employees. The Bow Valley has recently experienced a series of substantial housing developments and initiatives, all dedicated to addressing the region's escalating affordable housing crisis. These endeavours have been created to

provide housing solutions for residents grappling with

The Alberta government has committed a 2.3-hectare parcel of land for the purpose of developing affordable housing. This land will be entrusted to the Town of Canmore, thereby paving the way for much-needed housing in the foreseeable future. This project is expected to add an approximate 1,300 homes to the community and is expected to reach completion in 10-20 years.

Banff

With a vacancy rate just above zero, Banff's elected officials are taking bold steps to address the housing crunch. Their recent efforts include reducing parking requirements for apartment staff accommodations, revising housing policies to align cash-in-lieu payments with actual construction costs, considering a vacancy tax, and exploring limits on the size of dwellings.

The Town of Banff has also developed a downtown complex, The Aster, featuring 33 dwelling units aimed at providing affordable, for-purchase housing to eligible Banff residents. As part of the Banff Housing Strategy, these homes are sold at the cost of construction alone, ensuring affordability. Managed by the Banff Housing Corporation, this project is set to be completed in October 2023.

Canmore

The Canmore Planning Commission has approved an expansion of the Bow Meadows Employee Housing Project. While discussions did touch upon the appropriateness of employee housing in industrial zones, the commission's primary focus remained on approving the development permit application. The revised project now boasts improved living spaces and additional amenities. The ongoing debate surrounding employees residing in industrial areas remains a topic of considerable debate in Canmore.

Canmore Community Housing (CCH) is diligently working to diversify the range of affordable housing options available. A proposed upcoming project represents a significant stride forward, potentially adding 18 new units to CCH's housing inventory. This project aims to reduce the extensive waitlist for affordable housing units in the area.

Strategic Employee Housing Investment by the Transit Commission

Recognizing the critical role of employee housing in strengthening local transit services, the Bow Valley Regional Transit Services Commission has given the green light for the acquisition of a common amenity unit. This decision not only fortifies the stability of transit services but also addresses the acute challenge faced by its employees when attempting to secure housing in our region.

Upcoming Release of the 2023 Staff Housing Guide

In addition to these developments, we are excited to announce that the 2023 version of the Staff Housing Guide is due to be released this fall. This guide will provide valuable insights and resources to assist both job seekers and employers in making informed decisions regarding staff housing options in the Bow Valley. We look forward to sharing this updated resource with our community as we continue our commitment to addressing housing affordability challenges in our region.

BOW VALLEY LABOUR MARKET REVIEW

Labour Market Trends

Unemployment Rates In July 2023, the unemployment rate in Alberta stood at 6.1%, marking an increase from the 4.8% rate recorded in the same month the previous year. Meanwhile, the Banff-Jasper-Rocky Mountain House area exhibited a slightly lower unemployment rate of 5.1% compared to 5.4% in July 2022. (Source: Statistics Canada)

Occupational Demand Between February and July 2023, the JRC received 1,787 job orders from 369 employers in the Bow Valley, marking a 21% reduction in job orders compared to the corresponding six-month period the previous year.

Staff Housing In the Bow Valley, 36% of job postings included staff housing, marking a decrease from the previous year's 42%. From February–July of this year, Banff's job listings exhibited 44% offering staff accommodation, while Canmore's listings had 24%. Notably, there was a decrease in the offer for staff housing in Banff compared to the same time last year when 53% of jobs had accommodation available.


Average Wages The average wage in the Bow Valley was \$21.82 per hour during this six-month period, up from \$20.42 per hour for the same time period last year. This is a 7% increase. These wages are based on jobs posted at the JRC.



Development News

Banff

The Town of Banff is inviting residents to participate in updating its Community Plan, which will shape the municipality's decisions for the next decade. The plan covers various aspects like housing, transportation, the economy, community well-being, and environmental protection. Mayor Corrie DiManno emphasizes the importance of residents and businesses contributing to this once-in-a-decade opportunity. Public input occurs in two stages, focusing on goals initially and the draft plan later. The updated plan aligns with the new Banff National Park of Canada Management Plan, emphasizing conservation and visitor experiences in this iconic Rocky Mountain setting. Lake Louise

A fire broke out at the Charleston staff residence in Lake Louise on July 3 prompting residents to pull the fire alarm after discovering a neighbour had intentionally set his apartment ablaze. The instigator was charged with arson and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose. Approximately 165 people were displaced, with the Lake Louise ski resort facing an uncertain reopening timeline for its summer operations. Community organizations and individuals launched relief efforts and donations for those affected, as the fire took hours to control, and various emergency services, including Banff's Fire Department and Canmore Fire-Rescue, responded to the scene to prevent further damage. Canmore

The Town of Canmore town council approved an action plan aimed at addressing Canmore's housing crisis and securing federal funding through the Housing Accelerator Fund. The plan focused on encouraging long-term occupancy of existing housing, increasing rental availability, and establishing sustainable funding for affordable housing. Council tasked administration with various actions, including phasing out tourist homes, proposing tax policies for purpose-built rentals, exploring changes to residential districts for increased housing supply, considering infill housing, and evaluating options to eliminate single detached dwellings under the Land Use Bylaw. Bow Valley

On February 1, 2023, in Banff, the Bow Valley Regional Transit Services Commission (BVRTSC) proudly announced a new ridership record for Roam Transit, with 1.65 million passengers using the service across all routes in 2022. This marks an 8.5% increase over the previous record of 1.52 million riders in 2019. The substantial increase reflects a shift towards using public transit over personal vehicles to access the Bow Valley and Banff National Park. Convenient, frequent, and accessible transit options, along with fare-free transit in Canmore and for Banff residents, have played a significant role in encouraging this shift.
